

Jewellery



Children should not wear jewellery because this can be a danger to themselves and others in school. Please respect this ruling, which is made for the children's safety. This includes non-uniform days.

If ears are to be pierced, we ask that this is done at the start of the summer holiday so that studs can be removed during school time, we ask that parents remove ear studs on PE days completely, before the children come to school. If studs are not able to be removed, then plasters or tape must be provided to cover the earring safely. No other type of earrings other than small studs should be worn, if necessary.

Rings, earrings and necklaces are potential hazards and we seek parents' co-operation in this matter. The school shall not be responsible for accidents caused by the contact of ear study or jewellery with equipment or other children.














Attendance

We are seeing an increase in the number of holidays requested in term time, many of which are only arriving at school a day or two before the children are due to be absent from school rather than the minimum of 10 days prior. Please can we remind parents that children should not be taken out of school to attend holidays in term time. Taking leave in term time does disrupt your child's learning and can impact on their attainment, progress and social development.

As previously shared, parents will receive a fine if they take their child on a term time holiday. Fines will be issued if your

child is absent for 10 school sessions (5 days) in any one term or across two half terms.

The Authority issues Education Penalty Notices by post. Payment of an Education Penalty Notice is £60 if paid within 21 days, rising to £120 if paid after this time, but within 28 days. Education Penalty Notices are issued separately to each parent in respect of each child. A possible exception to this would be where parents are separated, and one parent has taken a child on unauthorised leave of absence without the knowledge / consent of the other parent.

Online Safety

As infants, we all rely completely on adults to help us resolve situations that are causing us to become upset or stressed. This is known as co-regulation. The next phase, once autonomy has begun to develop, is called self-regulation: this is when children start to become capable of exercising more control over their impulses and behaviour, and managing their own emotions.

This vital developmental milestone, however, isn't reached spontaneously. Learning to self-regulate requires sensitive guidance from trusted adults – simply talking with children about their thoughts and feelings, for instance, can ease the route to self-regulation. This #WakeUpWednesday guide has some expert tips for supporting children to reach this goal.

If we have to cancel the event due to inclement weather, we will decide by 10:00am and communicate this to parents and carers as soon as we can. Continued Concerns

I am writing to you once again regarding the way in which we park around the school. I ask for everyone who either picks-up or drops-off children by car to please prioritise the safety of our pupils by being vigilant about parking around the school. Kindly adhere to designated drop-off and pick-up areas, avoid double parking, and ensure driveways remain unobstructed. Please refrain from reversing into the school and residents' driveways, as well as the entrance to the farmer's field next to the Lower School gate.



Additionally, please avoid parking on the double yellow lines in front of the Lower School gate during drop-off, as it poses safety risks. I appreciate some might be running a little

late in a morning, but the safety of our children and the safety of the others on the road must be our first priority. Recently, there is also a rise in the number of parents and carers who are using the car park to pick-up or drop-off without any permission being sought or given by school. As others have, if you require access to the school car park at these critical times of the day, please email into the school office, or call and arrange a time to a conversation with myself, explaining your reasons for this request. Once again, the safety of our children is our top priority and there is a crossing between our two playgrounds in the car park. The children use this crossing very well, however, they do not always anticipate a cars arrival during this busy time of day.

Your cooperation is key to fostering a secure environment for our pupils and community. Thank you for your understanding on this matter.
