Online Safety

Potentially addictive online games are nothing new, but the specifics of this kind of media can vary enormously – and, as a consequence, the risks in each individual game are just as diverse. The city-builder Township is no exception: providing its legions of devotees with accessible, satisfying fun ... but exposing them to potential hazards at the same time.

However, any safeguarding issues that the game might have can (with a little knowhow) be neutralised – allowing young players to have some engrossing fun without adults needing to worry about children's data, their money or their mental wellbeing. Our guide outlines how to help young gamers enjoy Township safely and responsibly.











Uniform Reminder

Now that we have returned after the Spring Break, children are invited back to school in their summer uniforms. Rather than wearing shirts, tie and grey trousers, skirts or pinafores, summer uniform includes the option to wear:



- Blue and white gingham dress
- Plain white or logoed short sleeved polo shirt (airtex type with collar)

There is no change to the PE uniform the children wear

- Navy shorts
- House T-shirt [plain and in the colour of their House]; not coloured T-shirts or football tops etc.
- Sports socks.
- Trainers, suitable for either grassed or hard surfaces should be worn. [These can be the ones stored in school for playtimes. There is no need to supply more than one pair of trainers for school.]
- A <u>plain</u>, or <u>school logoed</u> navy-blue or black tracksuit is also advisable for the colder days.

Please can I ask for all children to wear appropriate PE uniform rather than branded sportswear of varying colours.

Important reminders

- For reasons of health and safety, sandals/open-toed shoes or jewellery should not be worn in school.
- Long hair (shoulder length or below) should be tied back with a plain hair bobble or band. For those with short hair, a reminder that fully shaved heads or decorative tram lines are not permitted.
